Dearhearts,

It was a particularly bad winter our first year in South Dakota. We had moved there the summer of my sophomore year from Mississippi. I had never heard the moaning of the wind as I did that night. Our old two-story frame house creaked and groaned as whistling sounds signaled that blizzard winds had found their way through unseen cracks and crevices around the windows.

There is nothing quite like the sound of a South Dakota blizzard sweeping across the prairie and blasting the landscape with white flakes dismembered and ground fine by its fierceness. All the world hides then, as did I, burrowing down deep in my covers and serenaded by a strange howling lullaby into a fitful sleep. It dropped to 34 degrees below zero that night. The high the next day was -20. The snow, blown thin on one side of the house, touched the eves of the back porch on the other. No one stirred outside that day. When we did venture out the next, we were wrapped and layered like mummies with no skin showing.

We all hole up when harsh winds howl outside our windows. It is human storms we fear most...those winds that can find their way through unseen cracks and crevices in our hearts leaving debris or haunting lullabies that play over and over again in the night for years to come. The danger is that the layers we wrap ourselves in will encase us in a cocoon that causes us to lose touch with our hearts...control or anger or keeping at arm's length those who would like to know us better. The hiding soul may move into relationships and then out, hoping for love...then running when it gets too close, gyrating between too much love and too little, between enmeshment and loneliness. This is often what our busy-ness is about...a frenetic, behavioral wrap that keeps us operating above the storm damage.

Christ's call to you and me is to come out of hiding. Christ called Lazarus forth from the tomb, then called him out from his grave clothes. One was a call from death. The other a call from crippledness. The one was

a summons to life; the other...a summons to living. He calls us all forth from such places and insists on the struggle of resurrection; letting us hobble unaided, bound hand and foot, to the mouth of our cave... How much do we want this new life? How willing are we to defy the forces against us? To let Him remove what has bound us? The struggle is ours...the new life is His.

All because He is after our heart.

He aims to get at hearts made cold by frigid winds; He aims to thaw our frozen places. He is about healing broken hearts and enlarging those shrunken by bitterness. This is why He insists on our forgiving "seventy times seven." Forgiveness is about bringing our hearts out of hiding and keeping them fully alive. When the storms hit, we all tend to protect ourselves and bind our wounds. But His call is to come forth from our caves into the bright sun of a new life.

Christ loves your heart and has moved heaven and earth to bring it to life and to keep it living. Your heart is the place where He began in you. It is His home here.

Amazingly, it is fit for a King and large enough to house eternity...if we answer His call to come out, and hobble our way to the mouth of our cave.
